Originally a volunteer at In-Definite Arts, Margo has been serving Calgary’s art community through her engagement with IDAS for five years, and brings with her a unique appreciation for disability art that is both approachable and culturally meaningful.

Between the years of 1985 and 1992, Margo participated in the ‘Summer Series’ visual arts program at Red Deer College while also attending the Alberta College of Art and Design. During this time she engaged in a variety of courses encompassing a diverse range of media including, but not limited to, bronze casting and jewellery. While attending ACAD Margo furthered her interest in the visual arts by pursuing sculpture.

In December 2007 Margo was invited to participate in the Balancing Acts 7 Festival in celebration of disability arts and culture in Calgary. Working in collaboration with another fibre artist from In-Definite Arts, she displayed work at the Art Gallery of Calgary and Art Central as part of a group show and silent auction entitled, ‘Seeing Ourselves’. Her willingness towards creative collaboration and her multidisciplinary background in the visual arts has allowed Margo to excel as both an instructor and an artist at In-Definite Arts.

Margo currently instructs fibre arts classes at IDAS, and is attending professional development courses in drawing and painting through the City Parks and Recreation Department.
